 MEETING TIME 7.30p.m. inside the Cathedral Grounds.

After leaving the Cathedral at 7.30p.m. (sharp) we will drive via Rathdowney to Border Loop on the Lions Road to Kyogle. As a car shuffle will be made on the Friday, it is imperative that we leave Brisbane on time. The walk will start at the Tick Gate on the Lions Road and will follow mainly the Border fence. The interstate rail line passes through a tunnel at the Border Loop and we will cross over this shortly after the start of the walk. With a little bit of luck we might even see a train. From there on it is up and down (with some big ups!) passing through open forest and rainforest with good views into the Running Creek valley.

During the morning we will pass the falls on Long Creek, and if time permits we may drop down for a closer view of these falls. Some time during the afternoon we will pass through a clearing, from which one obtains one of the best views of south east Qld.

Camp on Saturday night will probable be along the fence (or could even be at an old rabbit board hut near Mt. Tanna). On Sunday we will continue along the fence, taking a detour to avoid the steep climb over Mt. Tanna. As we near Mt. Lindesay we will drop down from the Border fence and head across country to the Rabbit board hut at the base of Mt. Lindesay. From there it is an hour's walk out to the Mt. Lindesay Highway, After another car shuffle we will then head back to Brisbane.

Even though the walk is relatively long, it is a moderate walk with excellent views. Water will have to be carried for the trip, however there is a possibility that it can be obtained at one of the rabbit board huts.
