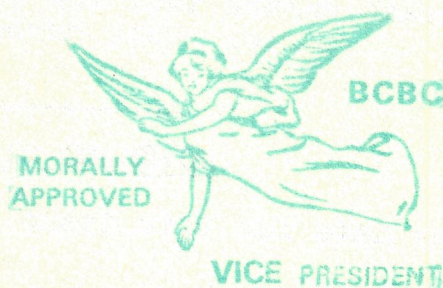

Therefore, it is essential that trip leaders ring the Emergency Officer by 9.00 p.m. at the very latest. Occasionally, this may require an S.T.D. call or trunk call. This implies that the leader should have an adequate supply of 20 cent pieces.

So next time you lead a trip, don't forget the Emergency Officer.
