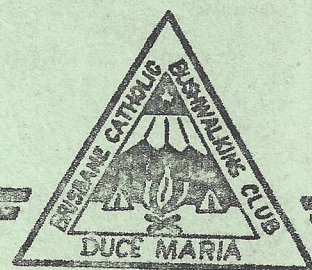

EDITORIAL

YOUR THIRST AND YOUR FRIENDS

Many members are unsure of the club's official attitude to alcohol, and the following statement is aimed at clarifying the position.

Club by-law 14 specifically prohibits drinking alcohol on club trips. This means that from the time the trip meets at Roma & Turbot Streets until it disbands at the same spot, alcohol is out.

There is no club ruling on alcohol at other club functions. However, it is policy that only soft drinks are supplied by the club.

The major reason for this is that we have quite a large number of young members, and we have a responsibility to protect the good name of our club. To supply alcohol to minors is to violate that responsibility.

If members want to bring alcohol to socials, that is their own business. As long as they are mature and responsible in their attitude we will never have any problems. Members should not feel that it is necessary to disappear to have a drink - that splits up the party and ruins everyone's enjoyment.

If you do bring alcohol to a social remember there are younger members there, remember that you have your car and act responsibly.

OUTINGS SECRETARY SPEAKS OUT

If you are leading a trip, please contact the outings secretary and arrange a map of the area. Also, if necessary, come over and read past outings report, then do a preouting over the intended area. Familiarise yourself with the terrain. Take names at the meeting and collect a \$1 deposit and note it. Add to this one list all phone nominations. Advise the outings secretary the names of all going on the Tuesday before the trip. Take note of the distance excluding unnecessary detours and poor individual navigation. Give an accurate account of the proposed trip to potential members of the trip.

Remember YOU are the leader. What you say goes. Be serious when you are on the trip. Remember trips are not democratic, there is only one head, no votes are taken. Trips are not changed because of pressure.

When the trip is over, all monies are handed to the treasurer. No reimbursements on the spot. Then all drivers hand to the treasurer a written statement asking for money giving name, trip, type of vehicle, number of kilometres travelled. Leaders of trips do not pay. Drivers do not pay. The trip leader gives to the treasurer with the money a statement accounting for how the amount was arrived at, plus the mileage, plus the drivers. Preoutings are reimbursed. The driver again hands in a statement.

The trip leader writes out a detailed repeat of the trip, a report that can be followed by future leaders. This is a step by step account of the trip noting time, distances, objects that are markers. Also it contains names of all on the trip, drivers indicated, and kilometres travelled. This report goes to the outings secretary as soon as possible.

OUTINGS IN RETROSPECT

LOVE'S CREEK FALLS 30th November, 1975.

Trip meets at Roma & Turbot Streets at 8.45am. Leaves 9am.

These two Mountains form Cunninghams Gap. Ann will first climb Mt. Mitchell, the southern peak. The graded track winds around the Gap side, giving alternate views of the Downs, then the Coast. Country is open gum forest with blackboys and ferns. Towards the end, you cross through the saddle of Mitchell - this is a double peaked mountain - and make your way up the natural steps to the top. A graded track all the way, not steep.

Cordeaux & Mitchell cont.,

Cordeaux is on the other side of the road. Again a graded track all the way. This time you make a detour along the western side of the Mountain, and then back towards the Coast. The end is a zig zag until you reach the foot of the cliffline. The track then follows the bottom of the cliffline - you cannot go all the way to the top - to get to the lookout. Further on, through the rainforest you end up at Morgan's Lookout.

Views obtained from both Mountains are the Coast, from Bribie to the Bay Islands and southwards. Other Mountains like Flinders, Walker, Greville are looked down on.

A good day's walk with lots of satisfaction for the muscle energy used.

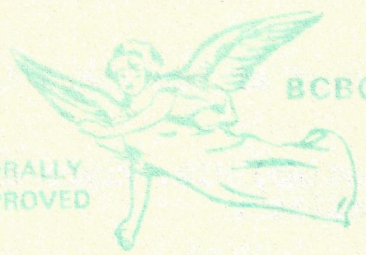
