

OUTINGS IN RETROSPECT

NORTHBROOK CREEK - Maree Reynolds - 4 December, 1977

Well, we picked a nice, hot day for this walk 370°C so the eventual swim in the "icy" cold water of Northbrook Creek was most welcome. Five miles passed Mt. Glorious, we walked down a private road for ½ mile then descended the south side of the mountain. After walking through pretty rainforest, lots of palms, we met the creek and walked downstream till we reached THE waterhole in a small gorge. We stayed there for 2 hours swimming and eating then walked all the way UP the mountain and returned to Brisbane by 4 p.m.

SEVERN RIVER - Russ Nelson - 16/18 December, 1977

Unknowingly we set out on Friday night on one of the hardest

throughwalks for some time. After a tour of the area west of Ballandean we reached "Sundown" station at midnight. From there we walked over a rough four wheel drive track for an hour. Our camp site had bushfires burning on two sides. There were still a few logs burning close by so we took advantage of the flames and boiled the billy. We hit the sack at 2.30a.m.

Saturday morning we slept in until about 6.15a.m. We continued further down the rough four wheel drive track for three hours. On the way we passed a deserted mine shaft and had reasonable views of the Severn River valley. While resting at one spot we met two men on trail bikes. We later discovered that they were fishermen from B allandean after river cod.

At about 11a.m. we reached the river itself and discovered that its flow level was about 35 ins. below its usual level. Soon we stopped for lunch and a swim as it was starting to get hot. After lunch we set off again and met up with the fishermen. There we discovered we were only $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from our campsite. As it was getting extremely hot we stopped for a three hour rest during which time we swam, told jokes and played "I spy".

Soon after 4 p.m. we dragged our bodies to the campsite which was in Red Rock Creek about the junction with the Severn River. That night it was decided to have an early start and have breakfast along the way. By doing this we hoped to do most of the walking before it got too hot.

The Leader woke the party at 4.30a.m. and the party set off at 5a.m. Even at this early time it was hot. After walking for an hour, we would rest for the next ½ hour. We were perpetually thirsty. We found ourselves getting thirsty even if we sat still. Fortunately we reached Red Rock Falls at 8.10a.m. and were on top of the falls at 8.30a.m. There we had breakfast. On the pre-outing we had early afternoon tea here. From the top of the falls there is a good view of the country we had walked through.

After relaxing and breakfasting we set off through country which had been burnt out by bushfires on Saturday. We also saw the remains of two old mines. By 9.45a.m. we had reached Friday night's campsite. There we discovered the bushfires had been active in our absence and could have burnt out our cars. Fortunately we discovered that the fires stopped 3 kilometres short of the cars. The walk finished at the unusual time of 11a.m.

Those on the trip were Jan Raymer, Maree Reynolds, Chri Neiland Keith Shapcott, John Carter, Ray Reynolds and Russ Nelson (the leader). I should like to congratulate those on the trip for the way they accepted natures obstacles and where still able to enjoy the walk.

BOONOO BOONOO RIVER - Jan Raymer 26/27 December, 1977

Nine people left Brisbane after 8.00a.m. on 26 December. After radiator trouble with one EH Holden, followed by problems with the other cars, we finally made it to Boonoo Boonoo River rather later than planned. We found a campsite and had a late lunch. By this time it was too late for any walking so we enjoyed a swim instead, followed by more eating, continuing into the early hours of the morning.

Tuesday morning we packed up camp and set off for Boonoo Boonoo Falls. It was quite a pleasant walk and a couple of beaut swimming holes were discovered. All the troops were very taken with Boonoo Boonoo Falls which were quite spectacular despite not having the usual volume of water.

We had lunch at the top of the falls and then headed back to the cars. Tuesday afternoon did not go without mishap, when "Handsome II" refused to make it up a hill. Several hours later the Stanthorpe RACQ succeeded in towing the car up the hill and we arrived back in Brisbane in the early hours of Wednesday morning.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS FOR EH HOLDENS

COLD START - pull choke, (it won't come out very far) 2 pumps on gas pedal and hold to floor.

HOT START - hold foot to floor, should start in a few seconds. This vehicle is fitted with Drum Brakes. Brake fade is not uncommon and can be quite hair-raising. This vehicle has NO sincro in first. If car boils there is water in back. Hand brake requires a bloody hard pull to be effective. Two hands may be required. If car sounds to be falling apart turn up the radio and hope for the best.
