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MORE WORDS ON OUTINGS

When taking names for a trip, leaders are to write them down on clean foolscap paper and note the deposit. When the remainder of the money is collected a total is then calculated. The leader makes no refunds of deposits or reimbursement to the drivers. The list of names and the money is handed to the treasurer as soon as possible after the trip. Also the list includes who took a car and if it is a four or six cylinder. Also state the official distance (state if it is in kilometres or miles). Then the treasurer can work out reimbursements. Remember for the time being drivers and leaders do not pay. Therefore, it is essential to note the vehicle and leader on this list of names. **ESSENTIAL:** Deposits are to be collected from everyone.

Drivers are to put in a written claim to the Treasurer for reimbursements. Otherwise one is not given. This claim states name of person, name and date of trip, type of car and number of cylinder, and distance. Reimbursement is done on the official distance, not on distance travelled. The piece of paper you write your claim on is to be of a resonable size - no scrap paper.

Also for drivers, if you are willing enough to take your vehicle, remember you are acting for the club and are to follow the route chosen by the leader to the trip and home again - no long detours. We have to get people home as fast as reasonably possible. We are not a group of friends inside this larger grouping of the club. We all are the one Club, the one group, and go for the total trip as one group.

Also, for everyone, no unnecessary trips to civilisation during a trip. We all should go on Friday night with the idea of spending the time in the bush, which includes sleeping, cooking, eating and walking. We do not go to walk in the bush and eat in town. Remember, it is a total experience.

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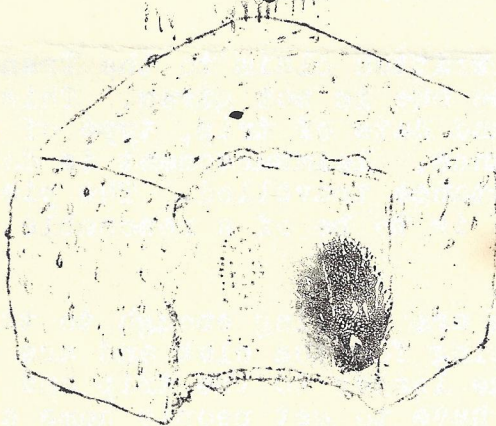

4. If the equipment is not returned by the due date, you pay a fine equal to the equivalent cost of hiring for each trip which occurs after the due date.
5. After being in the club six to ten months you are expected to have your own equipment.
6. The equipment Hire Officer name, address and phone number is always shown on Page 1 of the circular.

Sunday was spent swimming and walking along the beach at Caloundra. There were eleven people and three E.H. Holdens on the trip. Mass was attended at Cooroy 9.00.

WIANGARIE 9 to 11th January, 1976.

Basecamp Led by Kath Palmer

After overcoming, or rather removing such obstacles as fallen trees, fourteen bewildered people made camp in a clearing beside Brindle Creek. Next morning we were joined by two more and so sixteen set off along a track following the creek out to the Tweed Valley or Lomas Lookout where the only thing we could see was a sign erected by the N.S.W. Forestry Dept. (the rest of the view was mist and missed). We then followed the road around to our campsite. The area is rich in beautiful examples of Stag Horns, Elkhorns, Tree Ferns, Orchids and fresh water crayfish.

On Sunday, the party walked out along the razor back to the Tweed Pinnacle where once again mist obscured the tremendous views normally obtained. The party then took the track down to Grady's Creek Falls situated on the other side of the circuit road in the Wiangarie State Forest.

The weekend, I feel, proved how beautiful and interesting this area is.

These falls must be one of the most beautiful series of cascades and falls in eastern Australia. Three members of the party were able to get to the top of the falls and see the magnificent view.

Those of you who did not go missed out on some beautiful sing-songs, dancing, walking, views and a volcano named Mount Pamela.
