Larry's Story - Larry wants a good roll-up on this T/W which offers many attractions. The trip will follow the Main Border Track out over Mt. Merino before dropping into East Canungra Creek which will be followed down to Fountain Falls at the foot of which Arthur Groom wrote "there is a round pool 30ft deep out of which the stream twists in torture like a corkscrew, narrows in a deep gutter and rumbles down another 20ft in a double dash to a further deep pool overshadowed by towering rumbling cliffs". Of one section of the head of the creek Groom wrote "It is difficult to decide which is waterfall and which is cascade, when the whole quarter mile is such a lovely mixture of every form of leaping water." The creek below Fountain Falls is also spectacular but enough time must be allowed to cross the Darlington Range to the Cooma swimming hole where the graded track is rejoined. Be prepared for a Friday night start and large waterbottles ( $\frac{1}{2}$  FULL) could be useful. Bring songbooks for the campfire (in case of wet wood) and swimming gear for the hot fine weather. Trip leader will be at the meeting on the 12th with slides of the wald area.

Marianne also promises to give basecampers an active weekend of walking. More details at the meeting.
