EDITORIAL

It's a fair while since anything appeared in the circular about the Emergency Officer System, so here are a few points to note for newer members who may be leading trips and be unfamiliar with the system.

- 1) Just before the trip leves Brisbane the leader phones the Emergency Officer with details of names, addresses and phone numbers of the people on the trip as well as details of the proposed plan of the trip itself.
- 2) Immediately a trip returns the leader phones the E.O. to let him know the have returned safely.
- 3) If a trip is delayed the leader phones the E.O. as soon as he can reach a telephone, so he should have a supply of 20 cent pieces for S.T.D. calls.

The advantage of this system is that if a party is delayed someone is aware of it and if they fail to here from the leaders within a reasonable period of time, a relief party can be organised.

MT. BARNEY -

11th/14th June

Throughwalk:

Although the Mt. Barney TW was abandoned through lack of nominations, "it will be climbed again!" says Adrian; maybe when Chris returns from Central Australia.

Basecamp:

Eight basecampers with the throughwalkers met at the Lindesay diner then went in convoy to Drynan's hut arriving there just after ten. Some of the group walked into the club hut via the creek and the others went via the ridge, taking just a little longer, but not getting wet.

Saturday morning after collecting wood for the fire, we started walking at 9.00a.m. up along the creek passed the Lower Portals, and up onto the hill top for views of the creek below. Also Tom's Tum and the rest of Mt. Barney's north side were viewed then looking in the other direction we could see Mt. Maroon. We then dropped down to the creek and rock hopped along the creek to these falls which had no water then. We went further up until it reached midday and had lunch on a nice sunny rock site. Then back the same way to the club hut.

Sunday we started walking at 8.45p.m. up along the ridge directly to the side of the hut. We reached the second peak for a break and good views of Tom's Tum, Isolated, North and Leaning Peaks, also the club hut and Mt. Maroon and the coast in the distance in the other direction. We climbed down in to the gorge cont..5

and followed it down to the creek. Then on the other side we had lunch and boiled the billy. Then we rock hopped along the creek as the previous day back to the club hut. We arrived back early to pack and clean up the hut to have dinner at the campsite before Drynan's hut. Then we drove off to Rathdowney for 7.00pm mass. After mass we drove along the Mt. Lindesay Highway to some picnic grounds where we camped for the night.

Monday we drove further on the highway to Hardgraves' property. We started walking along the rough road track then over the paddocks gradually going up behind the cliffs of Campbell's Folly. Then a quick steep climb to the top on the lower side then walking along the top to the highest point where good views of Barney's East and West peaks, Mt. Lindesay Mt. Glennie and Mt. Maroon could be seen. Also the prison farm could be seen below us. We had lunch down from the top in a better clearing where we could boil the billy. Then back dropping down sooner, on to the track, leaving for Brisbane early.

Eleven people left Turbot Street on a foggy but fine morning. Even when the walk was started, the fog was so thick, no sign of the mountains we were to climb could be seen. Morning tea was on top of the smaller of the two Ivory Rocks at 10.30. From here, we looked down onto the fog which stretched for miles below us, right up to the main ranges and back towards Brisbane. Lunch was on the top of the larger Ivory Rock at 12 noon. We also had a look at a cave on the way up. From the top, because of the fine day, the rest of the Flinders mountains, Cuninghams Gap, Mt. Lindesay, Mt. Barney, Ipswich and Amberley Air Base were easily visible. From here we went to Mt. Goolman following a ridge across, for an easy walk. On top of Mt. Goolman was a tin containing names of groups of people who had climbed this mountain so we put ours in as well, before heading down into the valley and finally back to the cars by 3.30.
