EDITORIAL

"The Special Significance of August"

You may wonder what is so special about the month of August in relation to the Club. During this month a number of traditional events occur. It is these traditional occasions that draw the Club closer together. Active and non-active walkers meet and older and younger members join together.

This year is the 15th Anniversary of the Barney Mass. Therefore, in commemoration of the celebration of the First Barney Mass, the report of that event has been reproduced.

"CELEBRATION OF THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS ON MOUNT BURNEY"

For the first time in the history of the Club, Holy Mass was celebrated outdoors by the Club Chaplain Father W. Hayes.

The site selected for this wonderful event was Mt. Barney and a party of 58 club members and visitors participated in the trip which was held on Exhibition Wednesday, 17th August, 1960.

Setting out from a campsite a short distance from the Bushwalkers Ridge, on a bright sunny morning, the main party of 40 reached the saddle between East and West Peaks at 11.30 a.m., selected a site and set up a satisfactory altar of flat rocks a short distance up East Peak. There the necessary equipment, vestments etc. (which for carrying purposes had been divided among the various members of the party in order that everyone might participate more fully in the event) were made ready. The location was one of beauty and inspiration to the participants in the Mass which commenced at noon following the arrival of the second party numbering 18 which had ascended by way of North Ridge. Peter Lillis and John Power served at this Mass.

During Mass Father Hayes spoke briefly of the important events through the ages which had taken place on mountains and of the significance of the present Mass.

Afterwards a cairn of stones was built to mark the spot on which Mass had been oelebrated and permission has been obtained from the relevant authorities for a plaque commemerating the occasion to be affixed to this cairn.

WALKING IN SNOW CONDITIONS

The article written below is the first of two articles 'o be published on the above topic. The first article was wallen by Paulette (Fred) Ihotka.

"Skiing and Bushwalking in the Snowy Mountains"

Well as you can see by the title this is an article on my experiences in the Snowy Mountains.

The area is one of complete unique conditions. On a normal autumn day temperatures can drop as low as 0 and rise to 22°. However conditions such as cloud cover and fog, are known to rise without so much notice that a party of walkers could quite well be stranded.

Vegetation here is sparce and alpine snow gums of contorted shapes dominate the landscape. Alpine snow grass (a thick prickly bush) makes walking very difficult.

Also springs of melting snow appear without warning (as I can well admit).

Skiing here also, is a hazard due to weather, conditions, changeable weather can cause dangerous conditions. However, due to groups within the Kosciusko Hut's Association, (which I am a member of) maintain huts throughout the Kosciusko National Park. These huts have emergency supplies, and a fireplace, also dry fire wood. (asubstance very hard to come by during winter).

These huts act as emergency shelters during the skiing season.

Cross country skiing is the main past time, which uses these huts. As I have found from experience that without these huts, skiers would be non-existant in such conditions. On the last expedition I did 'o Kosoiusk the temperature dropped below -12 which is rather more than cold.

However, the reward for all this suffering is the most beautiful scenery in all of Australia, on top of the world.

alothing is the essential element in bushwalking -

Skiing in the Snowy area. An oilskin coat and overtrousers are essential also a down sleeping bag (that's a dig for Anne Nelson, thanks for the fab bag, it has saved me many times) goves, hat (all wool, a must).

All these make a successful time, one of reward and true fulfilling fun.

I'd like at this point just to say I feel that bushwalking in the Snowy for me, has been rewarded with an experience I could never receive walking in Queensland, however, it has re-inforced my desire to carry on. As I do, BCBC lives on in Canberra, and the Snowy Mountains.
